Tom Brunson is Retiring After 41 Years as Director of Music at Mt. Hebron



"There is a time for everything and a season for every matter under heaven." - Ecclesiastes 3:1

After 41 years of love, dedication and service, Mt. Hebron's beloved "Mr. Tom" is retiring on September 1, 2025! Upon arriving at Mt. Hebron UMC on September 1, 1984, with a young wife and 17-month-old son, Tom began developing and nurturing a music program that has become the heartbeat of this church and his personal legacy.

A native of Fairfax, S.C., Tom is the son of Jeff and Margie Brunson and was their absolute pride and joy. Growing up in a small town, his life was shaped around church activities involving everyone. "Tommy's" formal musical studies began with piano lessons at age 6 and continued with trombone lessons and marching band participation for 4 years. Through the encouragement of friends and family, he pursued instructional development for his singing talents beginning in his teen years. In April 1972, Tom drove to Estill to begin studying with renowned voice teacher Davis Powers. It was on that day that he met his future bride, Mary Powers, truly "the one whom his

soul loves." - Song of Solomon 3:4

In summer 1973, Tom was associate director of the Allendale County Youth Choir and served as director by fall. At his home church, First Baptist Church of Fairfax, he seized his first opportunity to serve as a church musician. In 1974, Tom became director of both the adult choir and the junior choir where his salary was a whopping \$50 per month! He also worked at WDOG-AM, The Big Dog, where the music was country in the morning and rock in the afternoon. Surprising to no one, Tom preferred the afternoons.

During his freshman year at Converse College, Tom served as a choral scholar at Trinity UMC. For the following three years of his college career, he worked at First Church of Christ, Scientist in Tryon, N.C. They had no choir, so he sang a solo every Sunday. The substantial sacred repertoire he learned, chosen by another musician within the church, would prove invaluable for Tom's career as a voice teacher and Director of Music at Mt. Hebron.

Tom completed his Bachelor of Music in vocal performance with honors from Converse College in 1978. In June, he began his career in full-time church music at Mary's hometown church, Lawtonville Baptist Church, in Estill, S.C., where Mary's father also served for many years. Tom remained there until 1984 when he accepted the call to Mt. Hebron. In 1988, he completed his Master of Music in vocal performance at USC-an endeavor made possible by Mt. Hebron's generosity, and one for which he is forever grateful.

What began as a small chancel choir, adult handbell choir, preschool choir, children's choir, junior choir and youth choir soon grew to a full-blown music program with choirs for every age group! First, Tom added handbell groups for both youth and children, and soon after, a senior adult choir, senior adult handbell ensemble and a third-grade tone chimes choir. At one point, he was directing all 10 choirs as well as various other ensembles. In 1998, he took the youth choir on tour in England, a trip made possible by the Rev. John Culp and the devoted

people of Mt. Hebron. For many years, Tom worked with Hebron Day School to prepare the children for special performances. Everywhere he went, little angels recognized "Mr. Tom" and hurried to give him hugs.

Ephesians 4 teaches that the Lord equips certain ones with the explicit purpose of teaching. Surely, He who called Tom Brunson equipped him well. Under Tom's guidance, Mt. Hebron's Chancel Choir involves young adults he led 41 years ago in the church's preschool choirs as well as many of his current and former voice students including his own daughter Becca. As the choir has grown in number and strength, the well-earned respect its members have garnered is due not only to their musicianship, but also their joy that is exuded when worshipping through song. The Mt. Hebron Chancel Choir, representing a significant portion of both Mt. Hebron and Tom's legacy, is stronger than ever.

Though change is inevitable, Mt. Hebron's music program has remained stellar. Post-pandemic, Tom revived the children's choir and junior handbell choir to accommodate the ages of children currently active in our church. Of particular joy, his adoring grandchildren were enthusiastic participants in his final 3 junior choir Christmas programs. Tom is truly grateful to the volunteers who helped re-establish the preschool choir and supported the junior choirs; these acts of service will help secure the future of music at our church.

In this next phase of his life, Tom is looking forward to time with family and continuing to teach voice lessons. He's excited to travel, read non-fiction (especially musician biographies), sleep as late as his heart desires, listen to opera-Mary will require headphones-and remain a lifelong learner! He deeply loves the people of Mt. Hebron UMC and will hold you in his heart forever. May we all aspire to honor his immeasurable impact with joyful giving of our time and talents, specifically SINGING!
