Message from Pastor Ann

Christian author Kristin Armstrong writes, "When we focus on gratitude, the tide of disappointment goes out and the tide of love rushes in."

As we enter the holiday season, that "tide of disappointment" can creep up quickly. The clash with a family member whose opinions differ from ours may be just around the corner. National tensions and political divisions can spill into our family gatherings. Studies show that nearly 70% of Americans experience conflict with relatives during the holidays — often over politics, religion, or lifestyle choices. Add to that the pressures of hosting, cooking, traveling, decorating, and managing finances, and it's easy to feel overwhelmed before Thanksgiving even arrives.



That's why we need "the tide of love" to rush in - to displace the flood of stress and disappointment and to fill our hearts with peace.

One spiritual practice that has helped me in seasons of strain or discouragement is making a Gratitude List. Years ago, when I was going through a particularly difficult time, a wise friend challenged me to write down 100 things I was thankful for. At first, it seemed impossible. But as I began to list blessings — both big and small — I found my heart shifting. Gratitude changed the way I saw my circumstances. It didn't erase the challenges, but it reframed them in light of God's ongoing goodness.

There's even science behind this. When we focus on gratitude — on what we have rather than what we lack — our brains release chemicals that reduce stress and increase contentment. Over time, gratitude actually rewires our brains, making joy and peace more accessible.

So, this November, I invite you to take the challenge: make your own Gratitude List — 100 things. See how love begins to rise and how disappointment starts to recede.

And if you're not sure where to begin, start here:

Be thankful for the unshakable truth of God's unconditional love — shown through Christ's sacrifice — that allows you to experience true joy, lasting peace, and the presence of the Holy Spirit in every season.

May gratitude be the tide that carries you through this holiday season and fills your heart with love and grace.

Thank you so much for keeping the spirit of the BBQ thriving and growing! We cooked 3,300 pounds of pork hams, 200 pork ribs, 600 chicken halves, and 75 beef ribs, which was a new item this year! We also introduced-for the first time-sides of mac and cheese and green beans. Sales grew by 35% from last year, and we underestimated the demand!

Did you see God at work? Did you see the men and women splitting mountains of wood or the Boy Scouts loading the pits? Did you see the men building the pits with precision? What about the stacks of supplies that were brought in or the conversion of the Family Life Center from a worship center to a warm and welcoming place? Did you see the magical lighting of the pit?
